Introduction to the course

This course is based on the National Occupational Standards and is a preparation for work qualification. It is suitable for those who have successfully complete the VRQ Level 2 Diploma in Beauty Therapy, and/or those who are already working in the industry but want to accredit their skills and knowledge. You will refine your techniques and approaches in a realistic work environment, giving you the skill-set required to pursue a successful career in beauty therapy.

Entry requirements

Applicants should have achieved the VRQ Level 2 Diploma in Beauty Therapy or an equivalent award, and have a minimum of three National 5, Intermediate 2 or Standard Grade Credit level qualifications, or appropriate life/work experience. Good communication skills, a willingness to learn new practical skills and working.

What subjects will I be studying?

You will work in a realistic salon environment, and build on your existing knowledge and skills. Subjects include:

Assessment methods

On this course you will be assessed throughout the year. You will be required to complete a number of formative assessments for each of the practical units prior to sitting your final summative assessment. Your summative assessments for practical and theory units will be pre-arranged through discussion with teaching staff, and will take the form of online, written or oral tests, and practical observations. They are graded pass, merit or distinction.

You will be required to wear a designated uniform in all practical classes. Full details will be provided at pre-entry guidance sessions.

You are required to purchase the designated kit, textbook and uniform.
