Our labs are always a hive of activity and practical work is central to the curriculum. Cloud chambers, flame tubes, fluorescence spectrometers, hydrogen and biotechnology equipment and a range of other instruments and research resources provide the opportunity for students to build their skills and knowledge at City and Fraserburgh campuses.

ENGINEERING

At Fraserburgh and Altens campuses our students learn in surroundings that replicate the world of work - from automotive workshops, complete with spray booths, to professional welding facilities and much more. A major focus is on developing the College's resources dedicated to energy transition - Fraserburgh has the recently introduced Future Skills Workshop and Altens will be home to the Energy Transition Skills Hub, being created in conjunction with key partners.

Our aim is to make securing a place at NESCol as straightforward as possible.

Applications are accepted right through to the start of each session, but courses can fill up quickly so we always advise applying as soon as you are ready. We keep in regular touch with applicants, providing all of the information needed to get started at NESCol.

The College knows that every student is different. We offer impartial and confidential information and advice on a range of topics.

These include: application and course advice; funding applications and queries; international admissions; induction information; transition from school to college; additional support for learning; assistive technologies; mental health and wellbeing advice; money management; key skills and study support; support for care experienced students; exams and graduation; careers, employability and enterprise; university progression.

FUNDING

Funding is a key consideration when joining NESCol. There are a number of different funding options available for full-time courses.

Most students will receive funding to meet tuition fees.

You may also be eligible for help towards the cost of living and travel costs while studying. Additional provision, including childcare and discretionary funding for those facing financial hardship, is also available depending on personal circumstances.



With annual ceremonies in Aberdeen and Fraserburgh, NESCol Graduations are a glittering occasion designed to ensure every student completing their Modern Apprenticeship, HNC, HND or equivalent qualification has the chance to share their special occasion with those closest to them. Always a highlight of the year, the events are an inspiring way to mark each individual's accomplishments.



The College year starts with Freshers' Week – a chance to settle into new surroundings and find out more about College life. In addition to promoting opportunities within NESCol, we also invite specially selected external exhibitors to join the week and to share information and offers with students.



WINTER FESTIVAL

In December, the College community joins together for a month of fun and fundraising, with a packed festive programme. In 2023 the events raised thousands of pounds for The Student Pantry, a NESCol Students' Association initiative designed to combat food insecurity among students by offering free store cupboard goods and other essentials. A free Breakfast Club is also run by the Students' Association.





Around 6,000 students enrol on full-time courses each year.

The total number of students under our wing at any one time grows to more than 20,000 through part-time, distance learning, schools-college partnerships and our role in the apprenticeship family.

SUPPORT NETWORKS AND EVENTS

Support is at the heart of our studentcentred approach. A number of initiatives are in place, ranging from those for care experienced students and student carers to the essential tips in the Hack Your Studies sessions, university transition and career events. There is also free access for every student to a variety of resources and advice through wellbeing specialist Spectrum.Life.

MODERN APPRENTICESHIPS

A Modern Apprenticeship provides anyone aged 16 or over the opportunity to achieve industry recognised qualifications whilst working. They come in all shapes and sizes, typically lasting from two to four years. Individuals must be employed to enrol on a Modern Apprenticeship programme.

DFN PROJECT SEARCH

This one-year internship programme is based on an international model which originated in the USA and supports young people with additional needs to gain skills and experience to go on to employment. 

ROUTES TO EMPLOYMENT

NESCOI is the gateway to a world of opportunity and we are here to support our students every step of the way.

Our courses offer progression to employment with a recognised qualification and relevant industry skills as well as the confidence to put that new knowledge and expertise into practice in the workplace. A recent national study carried out by the Scottish Funding Council found that a record 91% of the country's college leavers progressed to positive destinations, including work or university.

NESCol has close relationships with employers and a strong track record of providing talented recruits to businesses and organisations throughout the region, across the UK and worldwide.

We collaborate with businesses, industry bodies and trade organisations to ensure courses are relevant to the sectors they serve

The latest trends and developments are used to shape the way subjects are taught and industry links help to attract input from guest speakers as well as providing opportunities to take part in special projects, class field trips and much more.

The College also places a strong emphasis on developing enterprise skills and confidence amongst students at all levels.

Close work with organisations including Bridge 2 Business and Elevator ensure opportunities to get involved and to gain insight into the world of business. Many NESCol students have gone on to establish successful businesses and to provide employment across a host of different industries.



PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY

Achievements at NESCol open up a range of options when it is time to take that important next step.

The College can provide a direct route to university and hundreds of our students make the transition to degree courses each year. Articulation arrangements with RGU, the University of Aberdeen and universities across Scotland mean students can progress to year two or year three of university on successful completion of an HNC or HND.

According to a recent study, more than 55% of students leaving Scottish colleges with a qualification at SCQF Level 7 or above went on to study at university. NESCol works closely with partner universities to offer well established pathways and align courses to provide a smooth transition – with more than 50 links from NESCol to RGU alone!





NESCOI has partnered with RGU to make the transition from college to university as straightforward as possible.

The collaboration allows students to take their first steps towards a degree by studying in the vibrant and nurturing NESCol environment, with the aim of progressing to university when the time is right. The Degree Link programme is the perfect platform for students who aim to study at university after building qualifications, knowledge and skills at College.

Entry will be subject to specified routes through HNC/HND or certain knowledge requirements. Completion of a HNC will lead to entry in year two of a degree course and completion of a HND will lead to entry in year three of a degree course. In some cases there may be course-specific requirements, such as taking specified options on an HN programme, and some courses may require presentation of a portfolio or an interview with an RGU tutor.

Look out for the Degree Link badge on course descriptions, showing routes to RGU degree programmes.





Where a Higher or Highers are listed, this means a Higher award or awards from the SQA at any grade from A to D.

For those returning to education, if you do not have the qualifications listed, life and work experience can also be taken into account when you make an application. Examples include responsibilities as a carer, voluntary work or other activities that demonstrate your skills, knowledge and enthusiasm.

Qualifications equivalent to those currently awarded by the SQA are also accepted. Examples include those awarded in Scotland before National 4s and National 5s or Highers were introduced. Qualifications from England, Wales, Northern Ireland, Ireland and other countries are also accepted.



This is a highly demanding course, and you will undertake subjects and assessments for Higher Human Biology and Higher English, as well as Maths for Science.

- You must have been out of education for at least 3 years if your last course of study was up to SCQF Level 5
- You must have been out of education for at least 5 years if your last course of study was up to SCQF Level 6.

Working with a range of people mainly over the age of 16, you'll support individuals through all stages of the life cycle and help them maintain and improve their mental and physical health. There is a large placement element to this course, and you must be able to commit to shift work.

NC APPLIED SCIENCE

Course code: C00084 (City) C00085 (Fraserburgh)

Aimed at those with limited formal science qualifications, this course is designed to enhance your understanding of scientific principles and practice. With a focus on hands-on learning, you'll engage in experiments, practical activities and laboratory work. Examples may include studying microbial growth in food and generating electricity from chemical reactions.

Entry Requirements

- National 5 passes at grade C or above in relevant subjects such as Chemistry, Biology, Maths or Physics
- Or SCQF Level 4 Introduction to Science runs February to June, see website for details
- Comfortable studying at SCQF Level 5
- · Good numeracy skills.

NC APPLIED SCIENCE

Course code: C00086 (City)

Gain a sound theoretical understanding of science to allow future study at HNC/D level or university. You will choose to study either the Chemistry/Biology route or the Chemistry/Physics route. This course involves a large amount of practical work relevant to local interests, industries or topical issues. Examples of experiments may include testing aerodynamic design and efficiency using a wind tunnel and studying how enzymes work in our bodies.

Entry Requirements

- National 5 passes at grade B or above in two science subjects and Maths (Applications of Maths may be accepted if there is evidence of strong qualifications in science). If you only hold one National 5 in a science subject, this may still allow entry if you have evidence of strong qualifications in other subjects
- Or SCQF Level 5 NC Applied Science.

FORENSIC SCIENCE & BIOTECHNOLOGY

Course code: C00083 (City)

Offering both theoretical and hands-on learning, this course covers forensic science, a crucial part of a crime scene investigation. You'll also explore biotechnology, and how this harnesses biological processes for use in industry. You'll learn and try out forensic techniques like blood spatter analysis and fingerprinting, as well as biotechnological techniques such as growing bacteria.

Course code: C00082 (City)

This is an academically challenging course where you'll study four SQA Highers in Maths, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Environmental Science or English. Lessons are conducted in small group sessions and are supported with tutorial slots. This course will prepare you for further study in science and related disciplines at HNC/D level, or progression to university.

Entry Requirements

- Four National 5 passes at grade B or above in your selected subjects (Applications of Maths is not accepted).
 For those wishing to study Environmental Science, Geography or Biology may be accepted as an alternative to National 5 Environmental Science

HNC APPLIED SCIENCE (CHEMISTRY/ BIOLOGY ROUTE)

Course code: C00079 (City)

This diverse course covers both the theory and practice of modern sciences, focusing on chemistry and biology. You'll spend a large amount of time training in essential practical skills and the use of modern analytical lab equipment. Combined with scientific communication and presentation skills, you'll be highly sought after by employers. The HNC is one year of study.

Entry Requirements

- Two Highers in Chemistry and Biology/Human Biology, plus National 5 Maths at grade C or above (Applications of Maths is not accepted)
- If you only have one Higher in Chemistry or Biology, you need a National 5 at grade B for the other

It includes a large amount of laboratory-based work where you'll learn essential practical skills and how to use analytical instrumentation. Alongside this, you'll also develop your scientific communication and presentation skills. The HNC is one year of study.

Our labs at City and Fraserburgh campus are full of activity as practical work is a core part of our science courses.

City Campus has five labs and one instrumental analysis lab which features a range of specialist equipment. This includes a fluorescence spectrometer, flame tubes, cloud chambers and hydrogen and biotechnology equipment.

Each lab holds approximately 20 students and functions as a classroom, allowing theory and practice to be delivered at the same time.

The Scottish Wider Access Programme (SWAP) supports access to higher education for adult learners. SWAP access programmes run at colleges across Scotland and provide a route into hundreds of university degree courses. This course is specifically designed for adults who are returning to education after a gap and is not suitable for candidates applying straight from school or those who have a degree.

Entry Requirements

- You must have been out of education for at least 3 years if your last course of study was up to SCQF Level 5


